- 7. The judge is unable to comment on individual entries.
- 8. The judge's decision is final and neither the judge or the competition organisers will enter into correspondence.

- 10. For confirmation that your postal entry has been received, please include a stamped, addressed envelope with your entry.
- 11. No alteration may be made to poems once entered.
- 12. The competition organisers reserve the right to change the judge without notice and not to award prizes if, in their opinion, such an action is justified.
- 13. Entrants must inform the organisers immediately if their poem wins a prize or is published before the closing date.
